Local spinner top of the class at the **Royal Highland Show**


At this year's RHS, local amateur spinner ALaura Baigrie from Stow, was awarded the Jean Parker Prize for Best Exhibit of 2-ply handspun, extra fine, Shetland Yarn for lace knitting. She was also placed first in that category. It was the first time Laura entered the show, with encouragement from her fellow members of the Edinburgh Guild of Weavers, Spinners and Dyers.

Laura has been spinning for nearly ten years. In the last few years, she has moved into preparing her fibres from raw fleece, sourced



mostly from (also RHS-award-winning!) Allanshaws.

The winning skein, however, was spun from fleece produced by sheep reared by Stewart Runciman. These sheep produce fibre with a moderate, crisp crimp and short staple length, ideal for carding and spinning with a woollen long-draw. Laura is currently working on a thicker yarn from







Pickups4Peace is a Scottish based charity, delivering pickup trucks and 4WD vehicles filled with supplies to Ukraine. To date, 173 pickups have been successfully delivered. They are essential for the Ukrainian army due to the destruction of many roads around the 600-mile-long front line with Russia. The vehicles are used to transport wounded soldiers as well as supplies to the front. They are filled with essential supplies, specifically requested by the regiments, from bandages, generators, chainsaws, tyres and Jerry cans to defibrillators and medical supplies.

Fountainhall girl Georgie Nisbet (21), fundraised and made the trip in June, delivering a vehicle donated by a farmer from the Borders. This is her report.

"After a two-day drive, we made it to Lviv. I will never forget the look of profound gratitude on the faces of the soldiers as my co-driver and I handed over the keys to our vehicle.

"For the first time in my life, I witnessed what charity donating and volunteering can do. I won't see where these pickups end up, and how they manage on the front line. What I did see, however, was a photo from one of the soldiers of the conditions he had been living in near the front. A halfcollapsed room, rubble on the floor, and a sleeping bag on the ground. War is not pretty.

"On my final day, we went to the war cemetery in the centre of Lviv where city residents killed in the conflict are buried. This was the most poignant visit.



"Some of the graves showed photos of the dead in their military attire, but there were many pictures of loved ones in their normal life, their pre-war life, reflecting the desperate sadness which has been cast over this beautiful city and its people. As we returned to the bus, the concrete square with its permanent stage for funerals began to fill up. Three hearses arrived, carrying the bodies of three young men, killed between the day we left Scotland, and the day we reached Lviv.

"It was hard to appreciate the beauty of the city afterwards and continue our way like tourists after what we had witnessed. I saw families raw with grief, ripped apart. Girls my age who had lost a brother, a father, a partner, a friend. It didn't feel right to be sharing this place with them. I had absolutely no idea how to relate to what they had endured and what they continue to endure.

"That evening we experienced real Ukrainian hospitality, talking long into the night about the conflict and its effect on life and lives. I sat next to a girl from Kyiv, 21 like me. She poured me a glass of vodka and toasted us. I asked her if she was okay ."Of course " she replied "what else can you do?"

"In June, when we went to Lviv, the cemetery was half full. The July convoy reported back that the green grass we had stood upon, was now covered by fresh graves."

The joy of reading comes to Mpata Primary School

Our Luwatala Parish Partnership recently received a request to build a library in Malawi. This was a bit daunting as it did not seem to be an easy challenge by any means! The children in Mpata School do not have a supply of books. Learning is by the blackboard, repetition and memory.

Enquiries were made to find a potential source of funding, but there were many bureaucratic hurdles: not just a purpose built room was required but a qualified librarian paid to run it: and

that was before any books could be delivered! At this point, anything that seems too large to tackle, just needs to be handed over to the Lord in prayer.

Soon after, we received a message from a librarian in Blantyre, whom we had previously been in contact with about our challenge. He announced that some books had been delivered by a different funder: 'Books for Africa' and there were not the same stringent requirements attached. If we could fund the transport costs and joining fee for the National Library, he would set aside the books for Mpata. We are delighted to say that about 200 books have now been delivered and Mpata has assigned a teacher to be part-time librarian. Children are discovering the joy of



opening a book and learning from the written word.

There are about 400 children in the school, so its library is starting small. We thank the parents and friends of Heriot School who have given support





to this project to help build the first bookshelves, which will be the first furniture for the classroom. And we thank the Lord, who is always at work. ehartswood@gmail.com

STOW COMMUNITY COUNCIL – Autumn 2023

The Parish of Stow Community Council covers both Stow and Fountainhall.

Community Speedwatch – Stow Community Council is being considered for the Community Speedwatch Initiative by Scottish Borders Council but we need at least one more volunteer to participate. The Community Speedwatch involves a team of volunteers who record the speed of cars at a set place in Stow but never stop them. A minimum of four volunteers are needed. Teams of three work for an hour or two once a month at a place of their choice, initially with police support. Any resident



can take part. Any driver found speeding would be sent a warning letter and those dangerously over the limit would be visited by the police and reprimanded. The

equipment, including speed gun, hi-vis clothing and signage will be provided. There will be an hour or two of training. This could help to reduce speeding in Stow, which has been one of our priorities for years.

X95 Bus Service – Stow Community Council joins forces with Heriot Community Council in a few areas. After a successful campaign and meeting with Borders Buses, the X95 is now on an hourly schedule Monday - Saturday and buses run later STOW from Galashiels and Edinburgh. However, the service is still not sufficient for an evening out in either Galashiels MAUNITY C or Edinburgh, so our work is not complete. There is a two hourly service on Sunday. Please note that the times

for all buses have changed. Please check the Border Buses App for the new bus times. Staff at Galashiels bus station will also print out bus



timetables for anyone who requests one. Please use the hourly service. We are in a 'use it or lose it' situation.

Hazelbank Quarry – Work has restarted at Hazelbank Quarry which appears to us to be in breach of planning and is generating complaints from residents of both Fountainhall and Heriot. Stow and Heriot Community Council have taken the matter up jointly with SBC Enforcement and there is to be a meeting with SBC Officials and Councillors regarding this. There has been a joint objection submitted to Greystone Knowe Wind Farm which will have negative impacts on both Fountainhall and Heriot. Currently there is no further progress on this front. So far, permission has not been granted.

Elections only take place if more than the constituted number of members stand. Otherwise community councillors are simply appointed.

We represent the residents of the Stow and Fountainhall area on a wide range of issues and we are completely apolitical. We are consulted on some planning applications. Some can be contentious and we

have to listen carefully to the community. Three out of the four SBC Councillors for the Galashiels area come to the meetings and take up issues on our behalf. We receive consultation documents and a wide range of correspondence from many different sources. However, it is not about paperwork but about listening and being a strong voice for the area. It is interesting and rewarding but can be frustrating as many things do not get speedily resolved and come up time and time again.

Every year, we receive funding from the wind farms for microgrants of up to £300. We distribute this money as fairly and accessible as we can. We also have a hardship grant from the wind farms of up to £150, which is agreed in confidence between the four office bearers. Members can apply for large wind farm grants on behalf of the Community Council, with the agreement of all other members. This newsletter is among the projects funded by us through SSE. The Collection Bridge, which Robin MacMillan is currently working on, is another of our projects. The late Alistair Riddell achieved a great deal for the Auld Kirk. Other projects include the Paths leaflets, the 20mph Speed Signs and the Stow Layby. The new Jubilee bench is covered elsewhere in this newsletter.

Our meetings are on the first Monday of the month – the second Monday in January. There are no meetings in July. There is a zoom link for those unable to attend in person. Anyone who is interested is welcome to come to a meeting.

design and build the Stow Pump track after a tender process earlier this year. Velosolutions are industry leaders in pump track design and build and their pump tracks can be found across the world as well as closer to home in Hawick, Ormiston and at the Skelf in Edinburgh.

The final track design will be remodelled to check for impact on flood risk.

The pump track has been funded by SportScotland's Cycling Facilities Fund, the two local wind farm funds EDF Longpark Community Fund (Foundation Scotland) and SSE Toddleburn Community Fund and SBC's Place Based Investment Fund. The Cycling Facilities Fund (partnership between Scottish Cycling and SportScotland) is a legacy fund for the Cycling World Championships that took place in Scotland in August this year. The Scottish Borders hosted the Mountain Bike Cross Country World Championships at Glentress, Peebles, which was inspiring to watch. The UCI, the Union Cycliste

Internationale, cycling's world governing body, recently awarded the South of Scotland Cycling Partnership a UCI Bike Region

Label in recognition of its commitment to both elite cycling competition and cycling for all. We are the first region in Scotland to be awarded this label.

Pump tracks are both playgrounds and training facilities for bikers, skateboarders or scooter riders of all skill levels.

Earlier in the year, Live Borders cycling coach Trevor Bryant supported us to put on a challenge event for children from P1 to S3 to see how many laps they could complete on a course made on the site.
